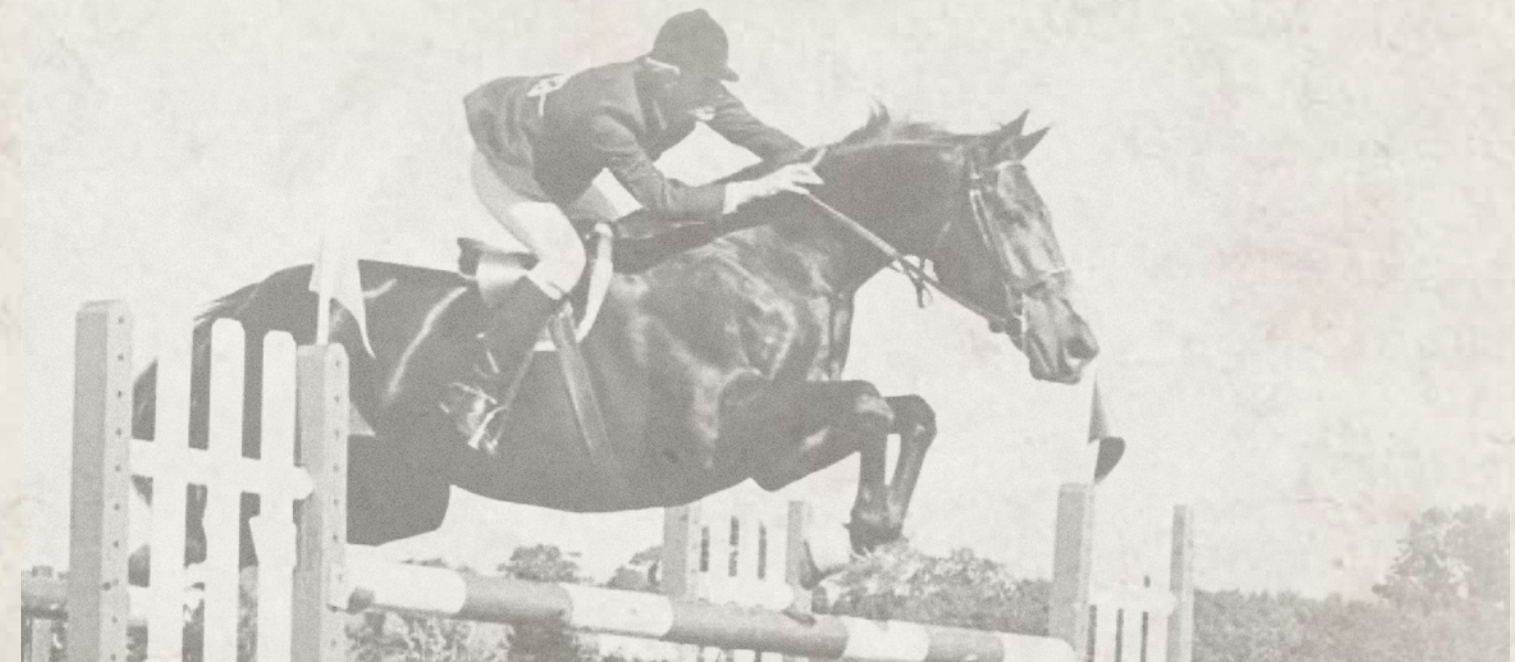

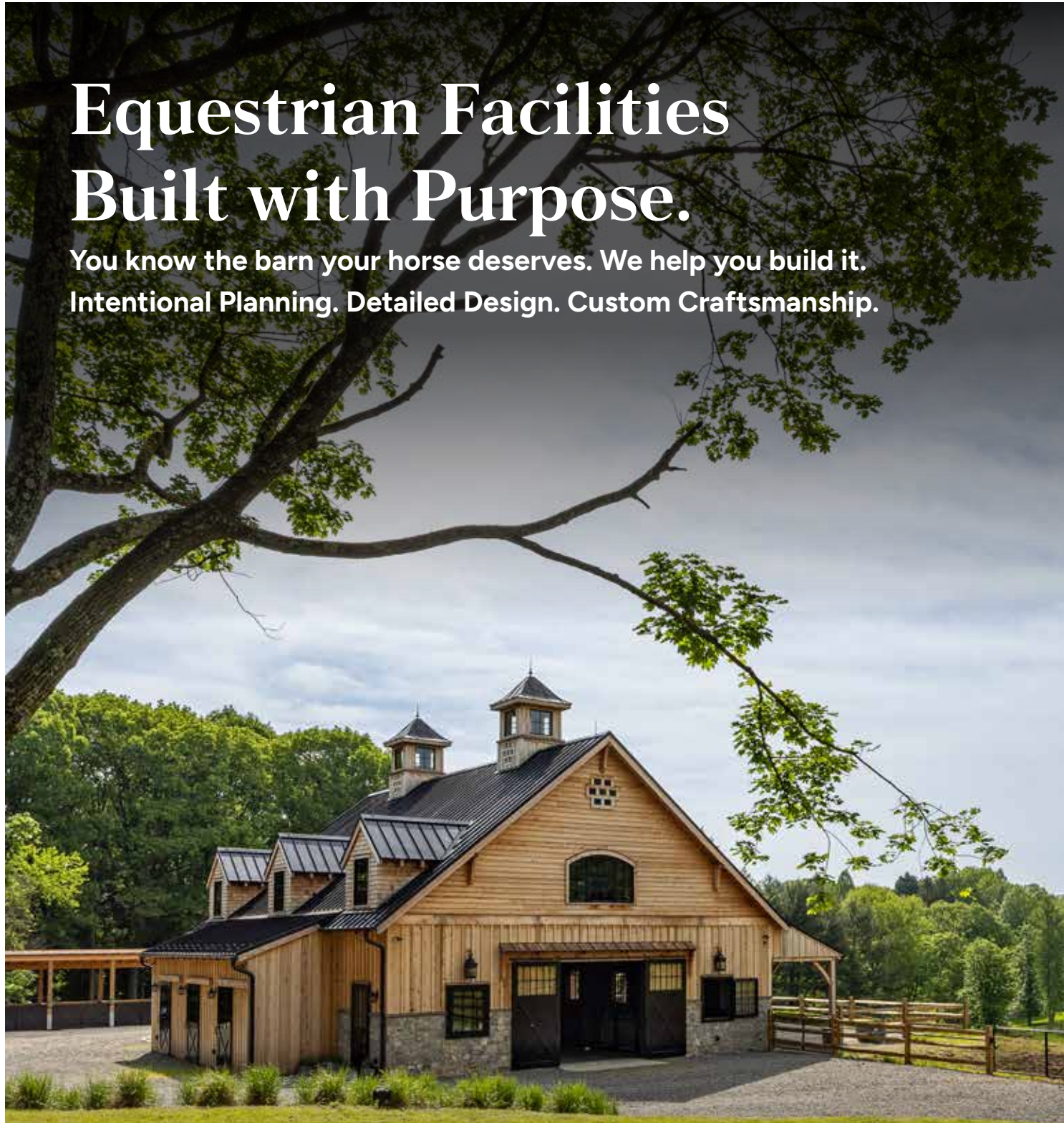

RULES, REGULATIONS, & SPECIFICATIONS



RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE U.S. EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION ("THE FEDERATION" OR "USEF") AND THE UPPERVILLE COLT & HORSE SHOW GOVERNING THE COMPETITION

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN THAT IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH

Life, senior active and junior active members of the Federation shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) Walk-Trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

In order to compete at a USEF licensed competition with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes (except those activities enumerated above in GR901.9 items 1-11) each horse must be registered with the USHJA.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing the entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulting or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the

competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber and competing only in classes that are exempt from membership requirements, I acknowledge and agree that I will be enrolled at no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew unless and until USEF determines in its sole discretion to terminate my Fan account. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice.

I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

1. Unless otherwise noted all classes are run in accordance with USEF rules and regulations.
2. The Show Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries accepted in any division/class (USEF Rule GR915).

3. Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis based on date and time stamp until the number desired is reached in each division or class. Show Management may vary the number accepted in each division/class in order to achieve the desired overall figure.

All entries will be initially submitted into a pending status until they are reviewed by Show Management. A non-refundable office processing fee of \$75 will be charged at the time of entry. After review, entries will be accepted in order of receipt and all additional prepaid fees will be charged at that time to the card on file. Entries placed on the wait list for all entered classes will not be charged any additional prepaid fees until they are accepted.

4. Show Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to deny, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to redesign any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes or to reschedule classes (after notice to exhibitors); to change rings or switch judges; and to change criteria in hunter, breeding and jumper classes as the show warrants.

5. Entry questions and communications will only be received at and answered from uchs.enter@gmail.com.

6. ENTRY CLOSING DATES:

HUNTER & JUMPER ENTRIES CLOSE APRIL 30, 2026 - Entries made after April 30, 2026, will be accepted if time and space permits, and will incur a \$50 late fee.

THOROUGHBRED HUNTER DEVELOPMENT ENTRIES CLOSE MAY 15, 2026. BACK FROM THE TRACK AND TOO SLOW TO GO ENTRIES CLOSE MAY 30. - Entries made after May 30, 2026, will be accepted if time and space permit, and will incur a \$50 late fee.

IRISH HUNTER ENTRIES OPEN MAY 1, 2026, CLOSE THURSDAY, JUNE 4, 2026, AT NOON.

CONNEMARA, CLEVELAND BAY, HUNTER BREEDING, LEADLINE, WALK-TROT, PONY BREEDING, AND SIDESADDLE ENTRIES OPEN MAY 1, 2026, CLOSE FRIDAY, JUNE 5, 2026, AT NOON.

7. Entries must be made through HorseShowsOnline. A current mailing address, telephone numbers and Social Security Number or Federal ID Number for each prize money recipient must be provided.

8. All entries must be accompanied by payment of necessary fees and applicable Association Membership Numbers. A credit card on file will be required for all entries before horse numbers will be given to the exhibitor. A 4% processing fee will be assessed for credit card payments at closeout. Exhibitors may close out accounts by check, payable to Upperville Colt & Horse Show (UCHS). Returned Check Policy: A fee of \$150 will be assessed for all returned checks. The account will be closed with the credit card on file, including the credit card 4% processing fee and the \$35 close-out fee.

9. Non-Showing Horses: A \$300 non-showing horse fee will be charged for any horse on the grounds that does not compete in one or more classes during the show. Non-showing horses must have a current negative coggins and proof of EHV vaccination record on file in the show office.

10. Pursuant to USEF rules, horses on the show grounds must present a current negative coggins and current EIV/EHV (Flu/Rhino) as follows:

- Coggins must be dated within 1 year of the last day of the show.
- Flu/Rhino latest booster must be dated within 6 months of the last day of the show. It is recommended that no booster is given in the 7 days before the start of the show.

Health Certificates current within 30 days are required for all out-of-state horses. These documents must be available for inspection by a representative of the State Veterinarian upon request. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds. Numbers will not be issued until all the required documents have been presented. Exhibitors are encouraged to use EquiTrace Event Pass to submit all coggins, vaccinations, and health certificates. If not using EquiTrace, please bring hard copies of all paperwork. Additional health requirements may be implemented if needed and will be listed on the show website and sent via email.

11. SAFE SPORT:

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

12. The USEF requires all horses competing at USEF-licensed or-endorsed shows to have a 15-digit ISO compliant microchip, effective December 1, 2025, for permanent identification, disease management, and security. (GR1101.10)

13. SHOW SCRATCHES:

Office fees are non-refundable. Stabling fees will be refunded for horses scratched before the April 30 closing date. After April 30 stall fees are non-refundable. Horses scratched after entries close will incur a \$150 scratch fee. Questions regarding show scratches should be addressed by email to uchs.enter@gmail.com

14. CLASS SCRATCHES/ADDS:

Adds and Scratches must be made online or in the show office by 4:00 p.m. the day before the class. No credit will be given for scratches made at the ingate or after the start of a class. Hunter scratches made after 4:00 p.m. the day prior and up to the start of the class will incur a \$10 scratch fee. Nominated jumpers may scratch without penalty up to the start of the class.

15. PRIZE MONEY:

Total 2026 prize money offered (Hunters) \$111,700

Total 2026 prize money guaranteed (Hunters) \$75,000

Total 2025 prize money offered (Hunters) \$86,700

Total 2025 prize money guaranteed (Hunters) \$75,000

Total 2025 prize money paid (Hunters) \$99,958

16. Prize money will not be credited against the show bill. Prize money checks will be mailed after the conclusion of the show to the person/company as indicated in the "prize money recipient" section of the entry blank. A Social Security or Federal ID number and mailing address of recipient is required before any prize money will be paid. A W9 form will be required for all prize money of \$1,000 or more. An IRS Form 1099 Misc will be issued.

17. Any rider, regardless of age, must wear properly fastened protective headgear that meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag at all times when mounted.

18. Riders may choose to wear protective vests in lieu of or in addition to a show jacket in Jumper classes. All other attire rules will still apply.

19. MOTORIZED VEHICLES:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing

the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

20. Jumping orders will be produced in accordance with USEF Rule HU126 and JP112.

21. Hunter courses will consist of any combination of the following: brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, panels.

22. For a list of classes that require jogging for soundness, see pages 30-31 and page 36.

23. The top-three placing horses/ponies in over fences classes in which the horses/ponies are not required to jog for soundness will be pinned in the competition ring at the conclusion of each such class. Other class ribbons will be handed to exhibitors at the ingate, or can be collected individually from a central location. Please ask the Ingate Officials or Show Secretaries for ribbon collection locations.

24. Champion & Reserve Champion and special awards will be pinned in the competition arenas.

25. Poling, including the use of offsets, is prohibited at all times.

26. There will be no schooling over fences in the competition rings at any time. There will be no longeing in the competition rings at any time. Longeing in certain warm up rings will be allowed at scheduled times. Check schedules at ring ingates.

FEI Warm Up - 180' x 220', all-weather sand and synthetic

28. Dogs must be kept on leashes or confined at all times. A \$100 fine will be imposed for damage, disruption or interference caused by your dog. *Please pick up after your dog!*

29. Sharps Containers will be provided in the stable areas. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of medical waste.

30. Upperville Colt & Horse Show, Inc., will not be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed or in any way damaged. Each exhibitor shall be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person whomsoever by any horses exhibited; and each exhibitor shall indemnify Upperville Colt & Horse Show, Inc., against all claims or demands of any kind or nature that may grow out of injury occasioned by any horse exhibited, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of such horse. The agreement on the entry form also applies.

31. Upperville Colt & Horse Show, Inc., will not be responsible for any injury, whatsoever, to any spectator.

32. Upperville Colt & Horse Show, Inc., reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any attendant or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

33. Exhibitors are on notice that any act of discourtesy or disobedience by them, their riders, grooms or agents to the judges or officials shall disqualify their entry and the owner shall forfeit all fees and charges, including any and all prize money which may have been won at this show. Show Management and/or the Directors of Upperville Colt & Horse Show, Inc., shall have the power to disbar the offending individual from further competition and to have that person and that person's entire exhibit removed from the grounds without being held liable for damage of any kind. The provisions of this paragraph are deemed and shall be accepted as a condition of entry.

34. All questions and conditions not covered by the USEF or these rules and regulations shall be decided by Show Management and/or the Directors of Upperville Colt & Horse Show, Inc., whose decision shall be final.

STALLS/STABLING & MORE

ORDERING STALLS

- All horse stalls must be ordered at time of entry. Stalls are limited. No stall will be assigned without a corresponding paid entry. In the event of scratches after the closing date, prepaid stall fees will not be refunded.
- National stalls are 10'x10' vinyl with doors on bluestone pads under tents. National stall fee is \$375 per stall for the week.
- A limited number of stall mats will be available for National stalls, at \$75 per National Stall. Please reserve on the Feed and Bedding Form.
- When entering, the entered horse can have either 0 or 1 stall requested. If a National stall is requested, it will be paid for with the credit card on the entry blank at the time we accept the entry.
- Extra stalls must be ordered on a separate Barn Account established on HorseShowsOnline at time of entry. A valid credit card for qualified extra stalls must accompany the Barn Account.
- A Barn Account can be created by going to Online Show Entry, click Enter A Show, select Upperville, and select Create a New Barn Entry. Enter all of your extra stalls on this account.
- Show Management reserves the right to limit the number of additional stalls if the quantity requested is deemed excessive. If additional stalls must be limited, the following formula will apply: Trainers or entries with fewer than three national showing horses may not be eligible for additional stalls; trainers with three horses may order up to two stalls; and trainers with more than three horses may be allowed one additional stall for every three horses beyond the first three.
- The stalls on the Barn Account will not be billed until checkout, and may be split. Deadline for stall splits will be posted in the show office. If splits are not submitted at check-in, all stalls will remain on the Barn Account and must be paid at checkout in full, without splits.
- A 4% processing fee will be added for all credit card payments except for fees that must be paid online. Exhibitors wishing to send in a check for their stall fee (after completing online entry) must email uchs.enter@gmail.com for instructions.

STABLING FORM

Trainers who select a stall for an entered horse must fill out a Stabling Form, found on the website under the Exhibitors tab.

- When completing the stabling form, please list all horses that should be stabled together.
- When completing the tack, feed, storage, and grooming stall field, please enter the total number of tack, feed, storage, and grooming stalls for the group that will be stabled together. The horses listed on your Stabling Form must match the horses entered, and the total number of extra stalls should match the requests on the Barn Accounts associated with the entries listed on the Stabling Form.
- Stabling will be available on Stall Master, www.stallinfo.net.

NOTICE: FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- The stalls are leased from Upperville Colt & Horse Show. Absolutely no subletting or re-selling of stalls is permitted by anyone other than Show Management.
- Exhibitors will be held financially responsible for damage done to the stabling tents or stalls, including punctures or permanent alterations. Damage fees charged by the tent company to the show will be added to the credit card/s on file, along with a 4% credit card processing fee. The trainer will be noted, as applicable.

As per USEF rules, no cell phone/electronic device use is allowed while mounted or longeing.

Management reserves the right to limit the number of horses and people in the warm-up rings. The rule of thumb is five horses at a time, maximum, per competition ring warm up area.

Please use the beautiful, designated hacking fields on the Hunter and Jumper sides for hacking, flatting, or additional longeing space.

SHOW SAFETY PROTOCOLS

The Upperville Colt & Horse Show will have both medical and veterinary personnel available throughout the show to protect the safety of the people and horses on the showgrounds. The show managers and others will support and work with the medical and veterinary personnel as set forth in the Show's written Safety Protocols to minimize risk and to facilitate the best possible medical response in case of an injury or other medical emergency involving a rider or any other person on the showgrounds, or a veterinary emergency involving a horse. The Safety Protocols' overarching objective is to reduce the negative impact of injuries by (1) decreasing the time from injury on the showgrounds to the provision of definitive care at an appropriate medical or veterinary facility and (2) optimizing the quality of care that is provided on site.

MEDICAL PERSONNEL

The medical personnel will consist of four qualified medical personnel as defined by USEF regulations. Two will be stationed on the Grafton Farm ("Hunter") and two on the Salem Farm ("Jumper") showgrounds during each day of competition, as assigned by the Safety Coordinator.

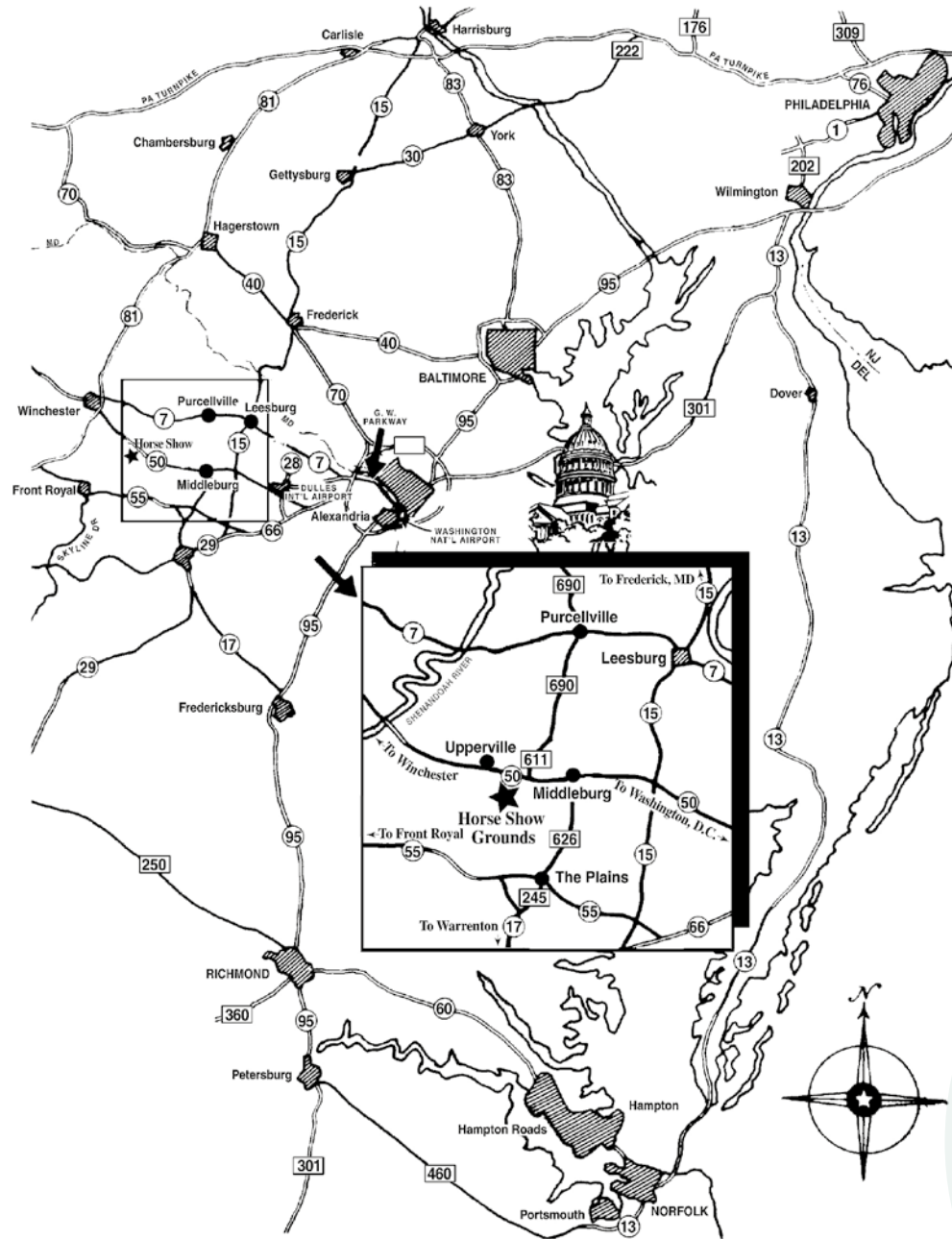

HUNTER CLASSICS & STAKES SPECIFICATIONS

USHJA INTERNATIONAL HUNTER DERBY TWO-STAR

Riders may not compete on more than 3 horses. All horses must be entered/declared by 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday. All horses must be on the ground by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday and must remain on the grounds until the horse is finished competing in the Derby class. Horses must be enrolled in the Derby Program and appear on the enrolled list or pay the \$150 non-enrollment fee. Horses must be recorded with USEF and USHJA. Riders, Owners and Trainers must be current active members of USEF and USHJA.

Ribbons: Twelve ribbons will be awarded for each round, and twelve ribbons for the top twelve overall.

Traditional Format: Tradition will be emphasized in the attire of both the riders and the horses. Horses will show in traditional hunter tack including snaffles, pelhams, double bridles and both running and standing martingales. Formal/dress attire. Judged by two panels composed of two judges in each.

Round 1-Classic Hunter Round: Judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going with pace and brilliance to be rewarded. Each panel will provide one base score. One point per high option jumped will be added to each panel's base score. The total scores (base + high) of both panels will be added to determine the horse's first round score. Minimum of ten (10) fences set at a 3'6" base height. Must include three to four high-option fences set at 4'-4'3" with at least one in-and-out, one bending line, and one line with an unrelated distance. Obstacles will simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and a variety of derby jumps will be used. 12 ribbons awarded for classic round.

Round 2-Handy Hunter Round: The top twelve horses (plus all ties for 12th) based on total classic round score will return for the Handy Round. Judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going with pace, brilliance and handiness to be rewarded. Each panel will provide one base score and one handy bonus score. One point for each high option jumped will be added to each panel's base and handy score. The total scores (base + handy + high) of both panels will be added to determine the horse's second round score. The total scores from both rounds will be added to determine the horse's overall score. Ties will remain tied, except for first place in overall. A minimum of eight fences set at a 3'6" base height. Must include three to four high option fences set at 4'-4'3". The course will simulate riding over trappy hunt country and will have a minimum of three handy options, such as: tight turn options, different track options, clever options for jump approaches, pen-type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle, walk over an obstacle not to exceed 18" in height, lead over an obstacle, halt and/or back, open gate while mounted. Twelve ribbons will be awarded for handy round and twelve ribbons for overall.

NAL/WIHS CHILDREN'S HUNTER CLASSIC Open to juniors who showed in the regular Children's Hunter divisions. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown in formal attire. Must be entered in Classic prior to the start of their division. First round score will be from the designated class on the time schedule. Top twelve scoring horses return for second round. Placings based on a total score from both rounds. Recognized by both NAL and WIHS.

USHJA GREEN HUNTER INCENTIVE STAKES To be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Horses participating in these classes must be enrolled in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Program. May be ridden by a professional, junior or amateur, and there is no limit to the number of horses a rider may compete in the class. These stakes classes will be held concurrently with the last over fences class of their respective height sections. Must enter stakes separately from the Green Hunter Division classes.

MARKEL AMATEUR OWNER HUNTER CLASSIC Open to amateurs who showed in the regular Amateur Owner division. Judged on performance, manners, way of going. To be shown in formal attire. Must be entered in Classic prior to the start of their divisions. First round score will be from the designated class on the time schedule. Top twelve scoring horses return for second round. Placings based on a total score from both rounds.

ROBERT PILLION MEMORIAL PONY CLASSICS To be judged on performance, soundness, suitability, and manners. To be shown in formal attire. Must be entered in Classic prior to the start of their division. First round score will be from the designated class on the time schedule. Top twelve scoring ponies return for second round.

NAL/WIHS ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER CLASSIC Open to adults who showed in the regular Adult Amateur division. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown in formal attire. Must be entered in Classic prior to the start of their division. First round score will be from the designated class on the time schedule. Top twelve scoring horses return for second round. Placings based on a total score from both rounds. Recognized by both NAL and WIHS.

THE PAUL & EVE GO AS YOU PLEASE HANDY HUNTER Judged on performance, manners, way of going and handiness displayed by their choice of fences. To be judged as a Handy Hunter class. Riders to choose their own line. Fence Heights will be 3'3", 3'6" and 3'9". There will be several elements particular to Handy classes that must be included in the course. Additional elements such as trot jumps will be available for riders to incorporate into their course. Riders are required to jump at least eight and no more than twelve obstacles and demonstrate a hand gallop. Horse and rider can only jump each obstacle once, unless the obstacle is set to jump in both directions, in which case it can be jumped once in each direction.

UPPERVILLE JUNIOR HUNTER CLASSIC Open to juniors who showed in the regular Junior Hunter divisions. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown in formal attire. Must be entered in Classic prior to the start of their division. First round score will be from the designated class on the time schedule. Top twelve scoring horses return for the second round. Placings based on a total score from both rounds.

HERMEN GREENBERG MEMORIAL SIDESADDLE STAKES To be shown over at least eight fences not to exceed 3' in height, in formal sidesaddle hunting attire and appointments. To be judged on performance and soundness, with emphasis on manners.

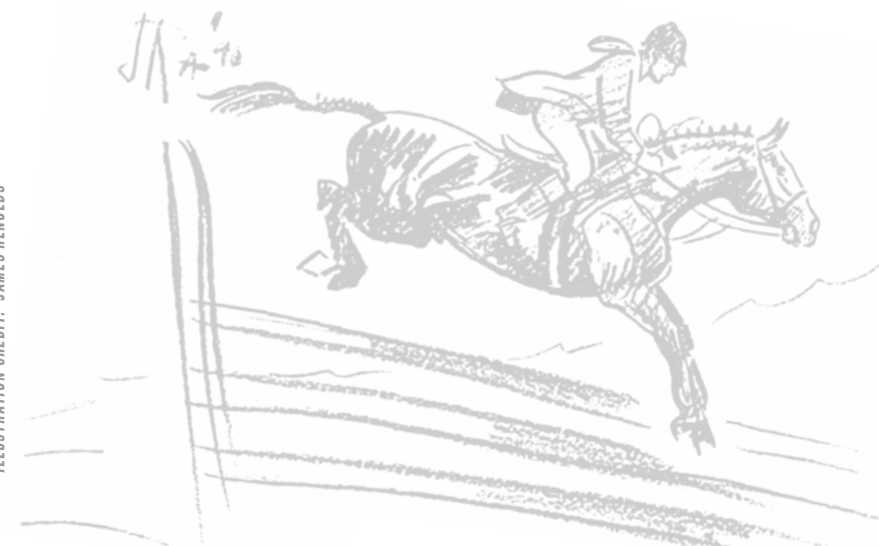
Round 1-Classic Hunter Round: A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round. Fences to be set at 3'0" There must be four higher height option fences set at 3'3". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher height options should include the more inviting, less difficult track. The Classic Hunter Round must include at least two changes of direction, one in-and-out, one bending line, one line with an unrelated distance and one fence with a long approach. A numerical score will be given by the panel judges. One point for each high option jumped will be added to judges' score. Tie breaking within the round will be done using the judges' raw score.

Round 2-Handy Hunter Round: The top twelve horses based on their total score from round 1 will return for the Handy Round. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered. Fences to be set at 3'0". There must be four higher height option fences set at 3'3". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing the height options, the higher height options should include the more inviting, less difficult track. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen-type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'6" in height, halt and/or back. Leading a horse over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. A numerical score will be given by the panel of judges. One point for each high option jumped will be added to the judges' score. Tie breaking within the round will be done using the judges' raw score. The total score from both rounds will be added together to determine the placings. Tie breaking for the overall will use the total score from the handy round.

Upperville Thoroughbred Hunter Derby Special Awards

- **\$500 High Score Amateur:**.....To be awarded to the highest-ranked Amateur rider in the Derby.
- **\$500 High Score Junior:**.....To be awarded to the highest-ranked Junior rider in the Derby.
- **\$500 High Score Mare:**.....To be awarded to the highest-ranked Mare in the Derby.
- **\$500 Best Turned Out:**.....To be awarded to the Best Turned out horse/rider pair in the Derby, as judged by a representative selected by Show Management

FAMILY CLASS

- The Family Class is an exhibition class under USEF Rules.
- "Family" is defined for all horse show purposes as spouse, parent, step-child, brother, sister, half brother and sister, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, grandmother, grandfather, and in-laws of the same relationship. In all cases the word "family" is to be used rather than a list of specific relations. Horses and/or ponies to be shown under saddle at a walk and trot. Manners and suitability of mounts to riders especially considered.

IN HAND CLASSES

Foal Classes

- Purebreds will be shown and pinned in Class 750. Partbreds will be shown and pinned in Class 751. Purebred and partbred Foals will be judged, both Mare and Foal will require their own (separate) handler. The Mare will NOT be judged in this class.

Youngstock Classes

- Purebreds will be shown and pinned in Class 752. Partbreds will be shown and pinned in Class 753. Purebreds and partbred that are 1-3 years old to be shown in hand. Handler must be able to show their entry at a walk and trot, and stand up their horse properly. All 2- and 3-year-olds should be shown in an appropriate bridle and bit. Yearlings may be shown in a halter.

Maturity Classes

- Purebreds will be shown and pinned in Class 754. Partbreds will be shown and pinned in Class 755. Purebred and partbred Irish Draught and Irish Draught Sport Horses that are 4 Years or older to be shown in hand. Mares with foal at foot are eligible to enter this class. Both Mare and Foal will require their own (separate) handler. The Foal will NOT be judged. Stallions may not enter these classes. Handler must be able to show their entry at a walk and trot, and stand up their horse properly. All horses will be shown in a bridle and bit.

STALLION PARADE

Stallion Parade

- Purebreds and Partbreds are invited to register for the Stallion Parade, listed as class 756. All Stallions must be shown in hand, with bridle and bit. No entry fee is required, but the horse does need to meet the Eligibility Requirements.

RIDDEN CLASSES

Under Saddle Class

- Purebreds will be shown and pinned in class 756. Partbreds will be shown and pinned in class 757. Horses and riders will be asked to walk, trot, canter, hand gallop, halt and back, after which the Ring Steward will ask riders to dismount and grooms will be called into the ring with their grooming baskets. The groom will assist with untacking the horse and wiping off the sweat, saddle and girth marks. The rider or groom will then present the horse in hand. Grooms must have their heads covered (wear a beagler, helmet, cap, hat, etc. at their discretion). While each class (756 and 757) is still in the ring, the Best Turned Out Groom will receive an award.

Handy Hunter Class

- Purebreds will be shown and pinned in class 759. Partbreds will be shown and pinned in class 760. Horse and rider MAY be asked to drop a rail, back, and trot over the fence; open, go through, and close a gate; pick up a light weight object, go over a fence with the object in hand, and set the object down where directed; and demonstrate a hand gallop to a halt.

CHAMPIONSHIPS IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE & IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE

All Irish Draught horses (Purebred) who have received a first or second place ribbon (both in hand and ridden) are asked back into the ring for the Championship Class (a fresh class) where Champion and Reserve will be determined based on performance in the Championship. With the placing of this class, the Best Turned Out Irish Draught Horse and Rider/Handler will be called into the ring to be recognized and presented an award.

All Irish Draught Sport Horses (Partbred) who have received a first or second place ribbon (both in hand and ridden) are asked back into the ring for the Championship Class (a fresh class) where Champion and Reserve will be determined based on performance in the Championship. With the placing of this class, the Best Turned Out Irish Draught Sport Horse and Rider/Handler will be called into the ring to be recognized and presented an award.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Owners/Trainers of Irish Draught Horses (Purebreds) entering the Irish Draught Breed classes at the Upperville Colt & Horse Show are required to provide a copy of their papers or passport to Michelle Robbins, at Kilronan1@yahoo.com, 703-307-8133 not later than two weeks prior to the first day of the Upperville Colt & Horse Show. The papers or passport will be verified to make sure the horse is eligible for the Irish Draught Horse (Purebred) Classes.

Owners/Trainers of Irish Draught Sport Horses (Partbreds) entering the Irish Draught Sport Horse Breed classes at the Upperville Colt & Horse Show are required to provide a copy of their papers or passport to Michelle Robbins, at Kilronan1@yahoo.com, 703-307-8133 not later than two weeks prior to the first day of the Upperville Colt & Horse Show. The papers or passport will be verified to make sure the horse is eligible for the Classes; eligibility requires a minimum of 1/8 Irish Draught blood for the Irish Draught Sport Horse (Partbred) classes.

Owners/Trainers of Stallions (Purebreds & Partbreds) entering the Stallion Parade are required to provide a copy of their papers or passport to Michelle Robbins, at Kilronan1@yahoo.com, 703-307-8133 not later than two weeks prior to the first day of the Upperville Colt & Horse Show. The papers or passport will be verified to make sure the horse is eligible for the Stallion Parade.

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

- All horses competing in Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with jumper classes (except those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-11) must be properly identified and must obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. A registration number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions. The Federation maintains records of winnings in classes at licensed competitions. Jumpers must be recorded with the Federation to receive points towards any USEF or USHJA Zone or Horse of the Year awards. Any change of a recorded horse's name and/or ownership must be recorded with the Federation in accordance with GR1105 and GR1107.
- Except where noted, the nomination fee of \$225 must be paid for a horse to be eligible for any Jumper Class. Once a horse is nominated, it becomes entitled to compete in all jumper sections at the same nomination level. The nomination fee need only be paid once.
- Horses must declare for the competition of their choice by 4:00 p.m. the day before the class is to be held unless otherwise noted. Nominated jumpers may scratch up until the start of the class.
- No poling and/or offsets will be allowed at any time on the showgrounds.
- The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 350 meters per minute, unless noted otherwise. The time allowed may be adjusted accordingly. In the event of a tie, there will be a jump off for first place only. All other ties will be broken by the time and faults in the first round unless otherwise noted.
- Entries in the Young Jumper Divisions must be age-verified by USEF.
- FEI horses may compete in any National Class until two hours before the start of the FEI Horse Inspection.

SPECIAL RULES - CLASSICS, STAKES, & SCHOOLING JUMPERS

- Horses must have been entered in and compete in at least one other class in the respective division to be eligible for the Classic.
- Stakes class counts as bonus points towards division championships. Ties broken by the higher placing horse in the stakes/classic.
- The Upperville Thoroughbred Jumper Classic is open to horses registered as Thoroughbreds and competing in the TAKE2 Thoroughbred Jumper Division.
- Schooling Jumper classes will not be awarded division championships.

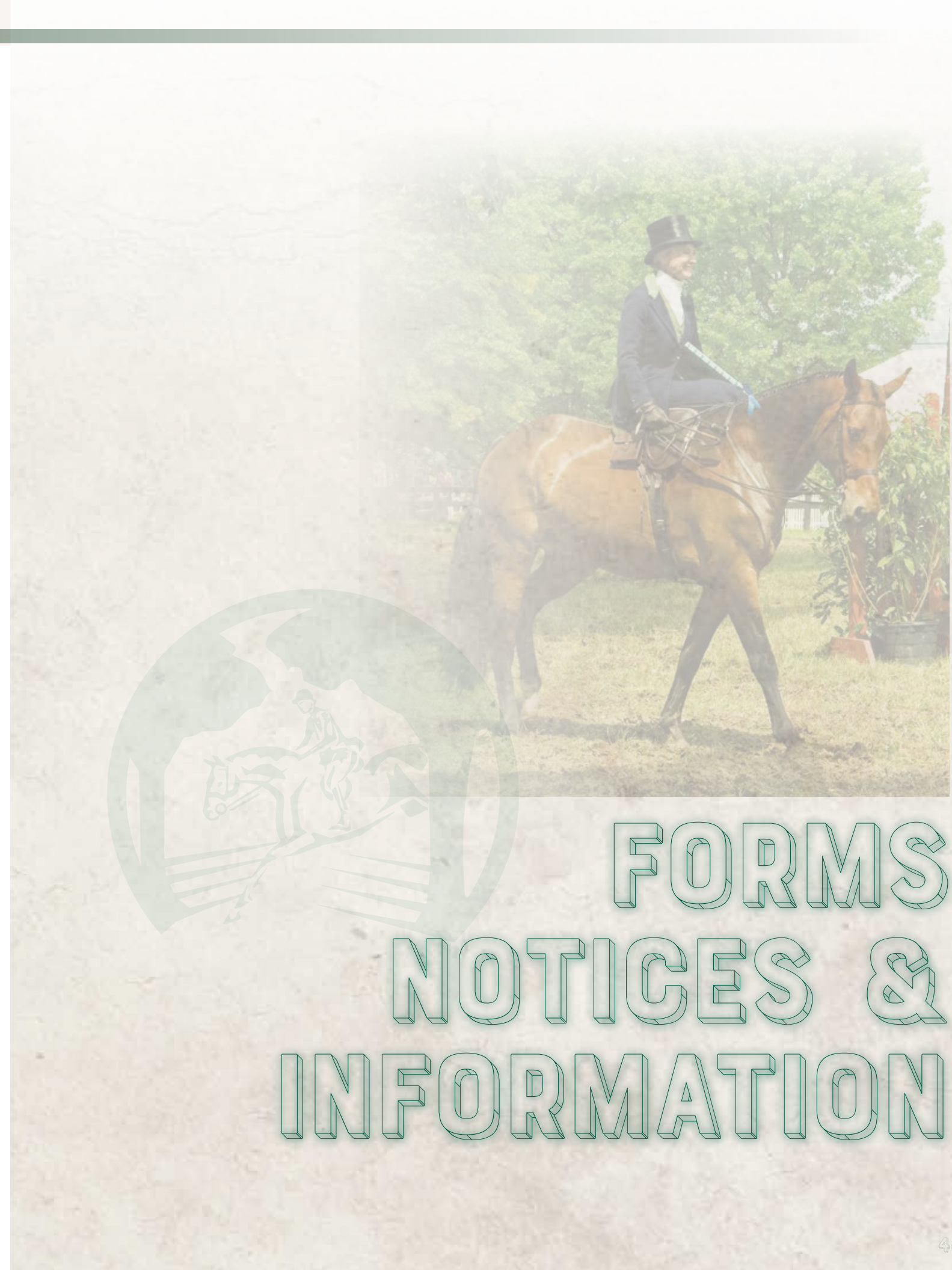
